

HOSTING THE WALL OF THE UNREACHED

What does the wall look like?

A series of black vinyl panels depicting the names of approximately 7,000 unreached people groups. Each panel stands alone, so you are not restricted to displaying them side by side.



What are the dimensions of the wall?

- The wall consists of 20 panels 3ft x 7ft and is 60ft long.

What can we expect when the wall arrives?

- It will be shipped via UPS or FedEx.
- It will be in two hard plastic shipping cylinders.
- Someone will need to sign for the wall shipment.

To assemble the wall:

- You will need to a team of 5-6 people to set up and dismantle the Wall.

- It is estimated to take about 2 hours to set up
- We suggest you dismantle the wall as soon as your event is complete so it will be ready for early shipping on the day following your event.

What is the Cost of hosting the wall?

Each host is required to ship the wall to its next location, using either UPS or FedEx. We may not know where the next host is until a couple of weeks before your event ends. It could be anywhere in the continental U.S.

- Signature must be required (This will add to the cost)
- The shipment must have shipping insurance for a total value of \$2500 (This will add to the cost)
- We estimate ground shipping cost to be around \$100-\$250 per carton. Ground shipping requires a maximum of 5 business days. We STRONGLY suggest that you get a shipping estimate as this can vary depending on carrier rates, distance and speed of delivery. Each carton is 41 X 15 X 13 and weighs approximately 70 lbs.

Each church or group using the Wall is asked to contribute a freewill offering of \$250 per Sunday to cover damage, loss, and maintenance on the Wall exhibits. This donation is needed but not a requirement for hosting the wall.
