The Manna Dhora people are part of the Scheduled Tribes, or Dalits, meaning they are considered untouchable by the rest of Indian society.

Along with the rest of Dalit society, the Manna Dhora people are often discriminated against by their government and society. Literacy and education rates are low.

The Manna Dhora occasionally consume fish, mutton, chicken, pork, and also eat the flesh of wild animals like porcupine, wild boar and mountain goat. They eat ragi, maize and rice as their staple food. The men smoke beedis, cigarettes and indigenous cheroot and chew betel leaves and tobacco.

Pray that the Manna Dhora would find acceptance and love through Christ. Pray that they would find self worth and value in their identity as children of God.
